PLEASE NOTE: Access to a child's SystmOnline will automatically cease once the child reaches the age of 12 years. Medication requests will need to be made via email to overdale.reception@nhs.net. It is generally considered that a child of 12 has the capacity to consent to who should have access to their medical record and can choose to withhold information from a third party. Giving online access to a parent/guardian could lead to disclosure of this information without consent from the young person. Wherever possible a clinician would always encourage a young person to involve whoever has parental responsibility in any treatment, but the clinician will decide as to whether a child is Gillick Competent and/or whether they meet Fraser Guidelines. These are terms within the NHS to determine if a young person is mature enough to make their own decisions. Once the child reaches the age of 16, online access can be given direct to the patient. The patient will need to complete an adult online application form and provide photo ID.

Patient information leaflet

At Overdale Medical Practice we allow our patients access to their medical record through SystmOnline Access Service. The practice will provide a username and password for SystmOnline which will allow you to:

- Book, check and cancel appointments (where available),
- Order repeat medication
- See parts of your health record, including vaccinations, test results and referrals.

In most cases we are able to grant full online access to your medical record which means you will be able to view your consultation notes showing the reason for your visit and with which professional, view your past medical summary including previous diagnoses, past procedures, allergies and sensitivities. This can be advantageous when needing medical care away from your GP practice and allows you to give the clinician and medical staff you are seeing your up-to-date medical information.

Most patients choose to download an 'app' to their smartphone to make access quicker and easier. The practice is not able to recommend one particular App, but audits show most of our patients use either Airmid or NHS App.

Things to consider when gaining online access to your medical records:

- *FORGOTTEN HISTORY* – There may be something you have forgotten about in your record that you might find upsetting and do not want to be reminded about.
- *ABNORMAL RESULTS OR BAD NEWS* - If your GP has given you access to test results or letters, you may see something that you find upsetting to you. This may occur before you have spoken to your doctor or while the surgery is closed, and you cannot contact them.
- *CHOOSING TO SHARE YOUR INFORMATION WITH SOMEONE ELSE* - It's up to you whether you share your information with others – perhaps family members or carers. It's your choice, but also your responsibility to keep the information safe and secure. We will not be able to monitor this on your behalf.
- *COERCION* - If you think you may be pressured into revealing details from your patient record to someone else against your will, it is best that you do not register for access at this time.
- *MISUNDERSTOOD INFORMATION* - Your medical record is designed to be used by clinical professionals to ensure that you receive the best possible care. Some of the information within your medical record may be highly technical, written by specialists and not easily understood. If you require further clarification, please contact the surgery for a clearer explanation.
- *INFORMATION ABOUT SOMEONE ELSE* - If you spot something in the record that is not about you or notice any other errors, please log out of the system immediately and contact the practice as soon as possible.

It is important you keep your username and password safe, if at any time you believe your password has been compromised, please contact the surgery immediately.
